Student Absence Reporting

At KPR, student safety is our highest priority, and we thank families for adopting the automated Safe Arrival system to help ensure students arrive safely at school each day. If your child is going to be **absent** or **late**, please call the **Student Absence** – **1-844-434-8119** or go to studentabsence.kprdsb.ca and set up your account. For new texting option see details below.

Safe Welcome Program

As we work to ensure the safety of all our students, we are continuing to lock all our doors and gates at 9:00 am. If your child is late arriving in the morning, please have them come to the front doors so that your child can sign in at the office and we can mark our attendance appropriately. Just a reminder that our school has a front door security system which includes a camera and intercom connected to the school office. A reminder that parents, guardians, and visitors are currently required to wait outside. We understand that this may cause inconvenience, but the safety of our students remains our highest priority. Please be patient if you are not buzzed in immediately!

Please also note that our phone lines are extremely busy much of the time. Our secretary is determined to respond to each call as quickly as she can, but your support is required to help things run smoothly. Please make sure that all plans are made with your children prior to the school day so that only urgent calls are made to the school. Please do not leave urgent messages at the end of the day as the phone lines are occupied and your message may get missed.

KPR Personal Electronic Device Policy

Our school continues to follow the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board's policy on use of mobile devices in schools. As you may have already heard, new provincial government legislation has resulted in changes to the use of mobile devices in schools. A mobile device is any personal electronic device (P.E.D.) that can be used to communicate or access the Internet, such as a laptop, cellphone, tablet or smart watch.

In order to ensure a focused and engaging learning environment in our classrooms, we require all personal mobile devices be stored out of view during the school day. As always, students who may need to use their phones are asked to speak directly with their teacher so that we can work together to find an appropriate solution. Please know that while we certainly understand that these changes may be difficult for some students, creating and maintaining a protected space for learning in our classrooms remains our priority.

Parents are also reminded that we strongly discourage the use of electronic games or other toys at school. These items can be a huge distraction to learning and the school cannot be responsible for these items when they are lost or stolen. Your assistance to ensure that students do not bring these items to school is greatly appreciated!

Anaphylactic Allergies

As we begin a new school year, please remember that we do have students in our school with life-threatening nut allergies. For students with food allergies, it is crucial that a safe environment be created for them which requires concerted cooperation from students, parents and staff. Together, a nut-free environment is possible. Remember that the best way to avoid bringing unsafe products into school is to read labels. We kindly ask that you do not send any products containing nuts to school in lunches or snacks. Thank you for your understanding.

Plans of Care



Every year, we re-establish Individual Plans of Care for everyone in our building who has a medical condition that could potentially be life-threatening. It is our belief that collaboratively creating a Plan of Care is vital to promoting the safety of each individual who suffers from a life-threatening condition.

Essentially, these plans are a set of directions and cautionary advice to help our staff through a potential emergency medical situation that an individual might face. The plan includes all the information that a first responder would require, as well as step-by-step instructions on how to respond to the medical crisis. All our staff members are familiarized with the plans, and they are posted in central locations for administration to refer to in the event of an emergency. If you are a parent / guardian of a child with a potentially life-threatening illness or a medical condition, please ensure that you:

- 1. Inform the school of your child's medical needs;
- 2. Schedule a meeting with your child's teacher to review the medical needs of your child;

- 3. Working with our Administrative Assistant, complete a Plan of Care for your child. If this has already been established, please make necessary changes to the form and send back to the school as soon as possible;
- 4. Complete the Administration of Medication form which details the request and authorizes the administration of prescription medication;
- 5. Provide the school with up-to-date epinephrine auto injectors (preferably a minimum of two), and any other prescribed medication, and keep them current;
- 6. Teach your child to take as much responsibility as possible for his/her safety;
- 7. Provide your child with a medic alert bracelet.

If you have any concerns or questions, please contact the office - and thank you for your full cooperation in keeping all our students and staff safe!

Bullying Prevention Measures



At Queen Elizabeth, we take the issue of bullying extremely seriously. We believe that everyone has the absolute right to be safe and feel safe at our school, and we consistently strive to make our school environment a secure place for everyone. Students are given consequences such as restricted recess times or community service for smaller issues, and they are suspended for more serious infractions. Research indicates, however, that sometimes children don't report when they

are being bullied, so we rely on you for information. Please call Mr. Beaton at the school if you ever think your child is either being bullied or is bullying others.

Police Record Checks

Criminal Record Checks are required for all volunteers, including members of School Council and our Breakfast Program Volunteers. If you are planning to go on a class trip, volunteer in a classroom, volunteer for a school function, you **MUST** have a valid criminal record check on file at the school. Police Record Checks are valid for 1 year. You can pick up the proper paperwork from the school to take to the Police Station or you can apply online at Please note that it may take a couple of weeks to get your Police Record Check back from the Police Station, so plan ahead. **Don't leave it to the last minute.**

Students Leaving School Property

At Queen Elizabeth, we prefer to have our students remain at school for the entire day, as this generally tends to be better for socialization, and also ensures that all students are on time after breaks, ready for instruction.

Some families may also choose to have their child come home on a nutrition break on a regular basis, and these arrangements can be made with your child's teacher and the office.

Other than that, students require written permission to leave school property for any reason during the school day. They may not call to seek permission during the day. Students who only leave the school property periodically need to bring a written note from a parent/guardian to the secretary's office first thing in the morning on the day that they are making special arrangements. With that said, we strongly discourage allowing students to try to go to the Chemong Plaza during their Nutrition Break, as the breaks are only 40 minutes long, and students are often late coming back, which is disruptive to their classes.

Picking and Dropping Off Your Child

For the safety of all students, please notify the school if anyone other than a parent or guardian will be picking up your child or children. Without notification, students must follow the regular arrangements made for travelling home.

We also ask parents or guardians to make standard arrangements to meet your child or children at a designated spot outside the school at the end of the day. If you need to sign your child or children out during the school hours for an appointment, etc., please come to the front doors and we will have your child or children meet you there.

Please review the basic safety rules with your children. We will be stressing safety at school and, hopefully between us, we can get the message across. All children should use the sidewalk where possible and cross in front of the school with our crossing guard. Bicycle riders are reminded that they are considered vehicles and are required by law to wear helmets and obey traffic rules. Parents are asked to make sure their children have and wear their helmets. Bikes are never to be ridden on

school property during school hours. Students riding bicycles are expected to dismount at the property's edge, walk their bikes to the racks provided, and lock them there for the day. Please note that we cannot be responsible for any damage that may occur to bikes.

Please return the Student Registration Verification Form to the school as soon as possible. These forms help the school update important information pertaining to your child. New phone numbers, adult contacts for emergencies and medical alerts are very important!! Thank you!

Sun Savvy

Although the heat of summer is fading, the sun can still be dangerous for our health. Damage to eyes and skin from too much sunshine is easily prevented with the few simple steps below:

- Limit time in the sun between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m.
- Look for shaded areas or create shaded areas to do outdoor activities.
- Wear clothing to protect as much skin as possible.
- Wear a hat with a wide brim or a back flap.
- Put on UV protection sunglasses.
- Use sunscreen with SPF 15 or higher that gives protection from both UVA and UVB rays.

What is School Council?

The purpose of school council, through the active participation of parents, is to improve student achievement and enhance the accountability of the education system to parents. School councils play a vital role in the education system in Ontario. They provide a forum through which parents and other members of the school community can contribute to

"Partnering to Make Our Schools Strong"... Education is a partnership involving parents, students, teachers, principals, school boards, government and the community. By being a part of the school council team, we work together to ensure a high quality of education for our children.

Why be involved?

Parents play the first and most important role in their children's education and are key partners in building a quality education system. One purpose of the school council is to promote and support the involvement of all parents in their child / children's learning. This involvement contributes both to the child / children's success in school and to the quality of the school environment. Participating on a school council is a rewarding experience for all those who value the opportunity to make a difference in their child / children's education. Membership on a school council benefits the individuals involved by providing the following personal advantages:

- being an important partner in the education system, whose views are valued;
- contributing to the shared goal of improving student achievement;
- having a vehicle through which to express opinions;
- being able to keep informed about what's happening at the school, the board and at the provincial level of education.

When & Where are the School Council Meetings Held?

Who attends School Council Meetings?

What is discussed at School Council Meetings?
